Exercise program for people over
50

*Begin by standing on a comfortable surface where you have plenty of room at your sides.
*With a 5-lb potato bags in each hand, extend your arms straight out from your sides and hold them there as long as you can. Try to reach a full minute and then relax.

*Each day you'll find that you can hold this position for just a bit longer. After a couple of weeks, move to 10 lb. potato bags.

*Then try 50lb potato bags and then eventually try to get to where you can lift 100 lb. potato bags in each hand and hold your arms straight for more than a full minute. (I'm at this level)

*After you feel confident at this level, put a potato in each bag.
